



Port Colborne Health and Wellness Centre Fact Sheet for Sept 2011

- Construction of the Port Colborne Health & Wellness Centre began in May 2011. This is a major construction project that includes the development of 145,000 ft² of building area and includes two (2) NHL size rinks, a 25 metre lap pool, a leisure pool, an indoor walking track, a gymnasium and bocce courts. This building will provide a significant improvement to the available services in the City.
- Over the past four (4) months, Residents in the neighborhood witnessed construction activity that included the installation of fencing around the construction area, the posting of construction signage, demolition of the Teeder Kennedy Arena, site excavation, foundation installation, steel erection of arena 1 and the construction of the storm water retention pond.
- To maintain safety on the site it is imperative that the public stay away from the construction areas which will be signed and fenced off. This work is scheduled to continue throughout 2011 and 2012.
- The park will continue to operate in areas where construction will not be occurring; baseball diamonds and soccer pitches.
- Pedestrian pathways will remain accessible during construction.
- Site photos have been included on the back side of this information sheet for reference. The bullets listed below outline the scope of work that is expected to be carried out during the next four (4) months.
 - Completion of Site Servicing – September 2011
 - Completion of foundations – September 2011
 - Backfilling of pool areas – September 2011
 - Steel Erection
 - Pouring of concrete floor slabs
 - Erection of exterior steel and masonry walls
 - Roofing
