Battle of Britain Parade

Approximately the same time, the Battle of Britain Parade will be held in Port Colborne.

The annual commemoration of the Battle of Britain honours the airmen who fought and died during the battle and recognizes those who continue to serve in the Royal Canadian Air Force today.

The ceremony, including the parade, takes place on the third Sunday in September.

More than one hundred Canadians flew in the Battle of Britain between July and October 1940 and 23 lost their lives; an unknown number also served as ground crew.

Historians have described the Battle, which involved almost 3,000 Allied airmen, as a turning point of the Second World War.

It was the first battle to be won by air power.

The parade will commence at Catherine and Princess Street at 1:30 p.m., follow south on Catherine and east on Charlotte Street. A brief ceremony will be held in front of City Hall.

The public is invited to attend.
